1 Corinthians 15:1-2 (NIV) Now, brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain.

3A. Believers will be _____ from the dead

1 Corinthians 15:51-52 (NIV) Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed-- in a flash, in the twinkling of an eve, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.

3B. Believers will live with Jesus

1 Corinthians 15:54, 57 (NIV) When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.
