2 Corinthians 12:1 (NIV) I must go on boasting. Although there is nothing to be gained, I will go on to visions and revelations from the Lord.

2 Corinthians 12:2-4 (NIV) I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven. Whether it was in the body or out of the body I do not know—God knows. And I know that this man—whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, but God knows— was caught up to paradise and heard inexpressible things, things that no one is permitted to tell.

	2 Corinthians 12:5-7a (NIV) I will boast about a man like that, but I will not boast about myself, except about my weaknesses. Even if I should choose to boast, I would not be a fool, because I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain, so no one will think more of me than is warranted by what I do or say, or because of these surpassingly great revelations.					
2.	2. God's plan is to keep you					
	2 Corinthians 12:7b (NIV) Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger [an angel] of Satan, to torment me.					
	2A. God says to prayers not in His will					
	2 Corinthians 12:8 (NIV) Three times I pleaded with the Lord <del>to take it away</del> [that he might remove him] from me.					
	2B. God's is perfected in your weakness					
	2 Corinthians 12:9-10 (NIV) But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.
