Psalm 74:2 (NIV) Remember the nation you purchased long ago, the people of your inheritance, whom you redeemed— Mount Zion, where you dwelt.

1B. _____ what's happened

Psalm 74:3, 7 (NIV) Turn your steps toward these everlasting ruins, all this destruction the enemy has brought on the sanctuary. They burned your sanctuary to the ground; they defiled the dwelling place of your Name.

1C. Speak of God's _____

Psalm 74:9-10 (NIV) We are given no signs from God; no prophets are left, and none of us knows how long this will be. How long will the enemy mock you, God? Will the foe revile your name forever?

Psalm 74:12 (NIV) But God is my King from long ago; he brings salvation on the earth.

Psalm 74:13 (NIV) It was you who split open the sea by your power; you broke the heads of the monster in the waters.

2B. Worship God as _____

Psalm 74:16-17 (NIV) The day is yours, and yours also the night; you established the sun and moon. It was you who set all the boundaries of the earth; you made both summer and winter.

3. Call on God to _____

Psalm 74:18-19 (NIV) Remember how the enemy has mocked you, LORD, how foolish people have reviled your name. Do not hand over the life of your dove to wild beasts; do not forget the lives of your afflicted people forever.

3A. Remind God of His _____

Psalm 74:20-21 (NIV) Have regard for your covenant, because haunts of violence fill the dark places of the land. Do not let the oppressed retreat in disgrace; may the poor and needy praise your name.

3B. Ask God to bring _____

Psalm 74:22-23 (NIV) Rise up, O God, and defend your cause; remember how fools mock you all day long. Do not ignore the clamor of your adversaries, the uproar of your enemies, which rises continually.
