	John 9:32-33 (ESV) Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a man born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing.

	John 9:34 (ESV) They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out.
